“Talon Talk” presented by Sandy Beck

Meet a variety of native birds of prey — hawks and owls — from the St. Francis Wildlife Association. Education director, Sandy Beck will share their stories, the amazing adaptations that enable them to hunt and survive, the important roles these raptors play in Florida’s ecosystems, and what we can all do to help them. Your heart will soar as you become enraptured with each bird’s unique power and beauty. This program is appropriate for adults and school-aged children.

The St. Francis Wildlife Association, a local, non-profit organization, was founded in 1978 to provide humane care and rehabilitation for North Florida’s orphaned, injured and sick wildlife. Each year they rescue and care for more than 3,000 birds, mammals, and reptiles with the goal of returning each to its natural home.
